

OHAD TALMOR, saxophone

Now American, Ohad is originally from Israel but grew up in Switzerland and is a long time Brooklyn NY resident. He plays regularly with his own project; NEWSREEL – a flexible group mirroring his multi-faceted musical identity and which features some of New York's most creative musicians: Dan Weiss, Jacob Sacks, Miles Okazaki, Shane Endsley and Matt Pavolka. Talmor's other projects include the Steve Swallow Trio (featuring Adam Nussbaum) and Mass Transformation – a Nonet featuring Austria's Spring String 4tet, singer Judith Berkson, Pete McCann, Shane Endsley, and Mark Ferber focusing on the music of Anton Bruckner.

Talmor also plays with Jason Moran, Josh Redman, Fred Hersh, Kurt Rosenwinkel, Chris Cheek, Dave Douglas, Carla Bley, Joe Lovano, Chris Potter, Billy Hart and many others, most of whom do not have major recording contracts – which is just as well.

Talmor has a privileged relationship with his old friend and mentor Lee Konitz, with whom he co-leads three projects: the Lee Konitz New Nonet, the Konitz-Talmor String Project, and the Konitz-Talmor Big Band.

As a composer and arranger, Talmor is equally involved in writing for jazz and classical idioms. His music has been performed by various jazz ensembles all over the world, including: Portugal's OJM Big Band, Switzerland's Big Band de Lausanne, Brazil's SoundScape Orquestra, the Brecker Brothers, Steve Swallow 6tet "L'histoire du Clochard" or Belgium's Bruxelles Jazz Orchestra.

His contributions in the classical idiom include music for pianist Martha Argerich, Sao Paulo's Symphonic Band, the Spring String Quartet from Austria or Portugal National Orchestra. Ohad's latest composition, a concerto for piano/drums and double orchestras, premiered in February 2010 by the Porto National Orchestra, the OJM Big Band with Jason Moran and Dan Weiss as featured soloists.

Ohad Talmor holds a composition degree from the Manhattan School of Music, now deeply buried in a trunk in his basement. Everyday, Ohad spends a considerable* amount of time playing and studying the bansuri (Indian bamboo flute).

*though the definition of "considerable" is subject to various considerations.

ABOUT THE BAND

Jazz came to the University of Iowa under the auspices of percussionist Tom Davis, whose first band met surreptitiously in the basement of the Jefferson Hotel for rehearsals. Alumni from that era include the saxophonist David Sanborn and many educators the likes of Jerry Zinn and Jim Oatts. Later, under the wily leadership of Dan Yoder, the top big band became known as Johnson County Landmark. While drawing on the milestones of jazz history for repertoire, this band encouraged the performance of original work and spawned the careers of many fine composers such as Bret Zvacek and Chris Merz. Other notable directors to follow the mold included Max Lyons, Paul Scea and Steve Grismore. John Rapson became the first tenure track professor of jazz in 1993 and has recorded seven compact discs of original music with JCL that have been released commercially. JCL plays free concerts on campus and makes frequent club appearances. They have been featured in regional community series and jazz festivals, with international appearances in Holland, Switzerland and Brazil.

JOHN RAPSON, director

John Rapson is a composer, trombonist, pianist, and recording artist for MoMu Records, Music and Arts, Sound Aspects, and Nine Winds whose work mixes ethnic and experimental elements with more conventional jazz forms. Jazz historian Mark Gridley has characterized his music as "extending several trends that were first demonstrated by Charles Mingus and George Russell." He has been professor of music at the University of Iowa since 1993, where he has collaborated on projects with Felipe Salles, Billy Higgins, Anthony Braxton, Kenny Wheeler, Carla Bley, Steve Swallow, Bennie Wallace, Rafael dos Santos, Matt Wilson, Anthony Cox, Mike Lee, Charlie Kohlhase, The Either/Orchestra, David Berkman, Richard Stoltzman, Bobby Watson, Peter Apfelbaum, and Jimmy Greene. Gramaphon magazine ranked his album *Water and Blood* as a "10; highly recommended" in its *Guide to Good CDs*. He has held previous positions at Westmont College in Santa Barbara, California (1980-90) and at Wesleyan University in Middletown, Connecticut (1992-93).
