As an Associate Professor of Instruction (jazz) at the University of Iowa, Dreier's duties include teaching Jazz Improvisation for Drum Set, Jazz Cultures in America and Abroad, and directing the Latin Jazz Ensemble. He also performs frequently with a variety of bands and ensembles, including

Three Dogs and a Bone, The Beaker Brothers Band and his own Latin jazz band, ¡RITMOCANO! This group has produced 2 CDs, Familia (2014, Realtown Records) and lowa Friends/Cuban Music (2020, self-released).

Dreier published Latin Jazz Guide: A Path to Authentic Percussion and Ensemble Performance (Hal Leonard Corp.) in October 2015. His second book, Standard Tune Learning Sequence: A Musical Approach to Improvisation for Jazz Drummers (Kindle Direct Publishing), is being released in September of 2021.
