Our goal is to make this production a valentine- a celebration of love for everyone. But also a look back at the class system and a gentle reminder of how little some things have changed in the past 144 years.



As this is my final production as the Director of Opera I would like to to thank everyone who has made my time here at the University of Iowa such a rich and rewarding experience. I am proud of the work we have done and feel extremely confident in the future of the opera program under the newly announced leadership of the Interim Director of Opera, Wayne Wyman.

SYNOPSIS

Before Act I opens, Ralph has lost his heart to Josephine, the daughter of his commanding offiver, Captain Corcoran. Josephine secretly loves Ralph, but class propriety and the Captains hopes for her marriage to the First Lord of the Admiralty, Sir Joseph Porter, have silenced any proclamations of love.

ACT I - Quarterdeck of the H.M.S. Pinafore

As Act I opens, the Pinafore sailors are readying their ship for Sir Joseph's inspection. Little Buttercup, a peddler woman, hints of dark secrets from the past. Sir Joseph arrives with his female relatives, explains his rise to high rank, and encourages the sailors to believe they are the equal of any man-except himself. Sir Joseph stresses strict observation of all amenities of speech

Josephine finds Sir Joseph insufferable and when Ralph proposes, threatening suicide if she refuses, she agrees to elope. The act ends with the sailors rejoicing at Ralph's success and dick Deadeye warning that celebration is premature since he will see that their plans fail.

ACT II - Same Scene, that night

Act II finds the Captain despairing at the conduct of his crew and Josephine's coldness towards Sir Joseph. Little Buttercup attempts to console the man she loves with prophecies of impending change. Sir Joseph tells the Captain that he has been thoroughly discouraged by Josephine and wants to call off the marriage. The Captain suggests that his daughter may feel herself socially inferior to Sir Joseph, urging him to assure her that social rank should not be a barrier to marriage. Sir Joseph does, unaware that his words are just as applicable to Josephine in relation to Ralph. Thinking she accepts him, he joins her and the Captain in "The Bell Trio."

Dick Deadey informs the Captain of the planed elopement. When the Captain intercepts the couple he is in such a rage that he cries, "Damme!" He is overheard by Sir Joseph who, horrified by the uncouth language, sends him to his quarters in disgrace. But upon hearing that Josephine was eloping, he angrily orders Ralph put in irons.

Little Buttercup now confesses her secret, which, amazingly, brings all involved to a happy finale.

ARTISTIC TEAM BIOS

BILL THEISEN (director) made his professional theatre debut at the Skylight Opera Theatre in his hometown of Milwaukee, Wisconsin in 1981. His longtime affiliation with the company came full circle when he returned to serve as artistic director from 2004 through 2013. Bill has directed over 100 productions for theatre and opera companies from coast to coast. Recent directing credits include *The Pirates of Penzance* for Santa Fe Opera, *Showboat* with Gateway Playhouse, *H.M.S. Pinafore, The Barber of Seville*, and *The Mikado* at Lyric Opera of Kansas City, *Sweeney Todd* with Cleveland Opera, and *The Magic Flute* for Virginia Opera. Mr. Theisen works frequently on the university level as a guest director and lecturer. He served as the interim director of opera at the University of Iowa in 1998 and has continued that relationship for the past 15 years culminating in his returning to the university as the full time director of opera beginning in the fall 2013. Bill was the artistic director of the Capitol Center for the Performing Arts in Upstate New York and is an adjudicator for arts programming on PBS.

WAYNE WYMAN (conductor, musical preparation) is an accomplished coach, stage director, and conductor whose career has included numerous guest appearances as well as serving as artistic director of Capital Opera (Raleigh, NC) and Lyric Opera of San Antonio. His work has been consistently well-received by audiences and critics: "Most impressive was the confidence in the pit. Wayne Wyman led his orchestra through the moods and colors of this gorgeous score with knowledgeable Gallic style...Wyman repeatedly seduced the listener with sensuous nuance." (Carmen, Roy Dicks, Raleigh News & Observer) While at the artistic helm of the San Antonio company, Wyman founded and directed the Lyric Studio young artist program, whose alumni now perform at leading opera houses, including the Vienna State Opera, La Scala, and the Metropolitan Opera. Since 2005, his summers are spent in Graz, Austria on the faculty of the American Institute for Musical Studies (AIMS). Wyman earned an Artist Diploma in Opera from the Cincinnati Conservatory and studied privately with the director of opera at the Hochschule für Musik und darstellende Kunst in Vienna. Since 2012 Wyman has been the opera coach at the University of Iowa and has enjoyed many years of collaboration with the Director of Opera, Bill Theisen. As Prof. Theisen concludes his successful tenure here, Wyman wishes him well and looks forward to new adventures as the Interim Director of Opera beginning Fall 2022.

MARGARET WENK-KUCHLBAUER, is the Scenery and Costume Designer for UI Division of Performing Arts Production Unit, collaborating with many UI faculty and guests. In this extraordinary year and a half, challenging all our norms, latest opera designs include scenery for *The Light in the Piazza*, co-production with

BRYON WINN (lighting designer) Bryon is delighted to have the opportunity to collaborate with Bill, Margaret, and Briana on *H.M.S. Pinafore*. He is a professor of design and Director of Theatre for the Department of Theatre Arts at the University of Iowa. He has designed over 250 productions for theatre, opera, dance, and corporate events throughout the country. This includes the recent SOM Opera productions of *Three Decembers, Grand Night for Singing, Cosi Fan Tutte, The Medium*, and *The Pirates of Penzance*. Bryon is a member of United Scenic Artists 829.

MINJI KWON (rehearsal pianist) Korean-born pianist Minji Kwon is an insightful collaborator, educator and musician. Ms. Kwon was granted the Ambassadorial Scholarship from the Rotary Foundation to study in the US. She was the recipient of the Iowa Performance Fellowship while working on her DMA with Dr. Uriel Tsachor at the University of Iowa. Ms. Kwon taught as Adjunct Professor at New York University, where she earned her Master's degree in Collaborative Piano. Ms. Kwon internationally appeared in cities like Seoul, Prague, Mexico City, Chicago, and New York City in such major venues as Stern Auditorium and Weill Recital Hall in Carnegie Hall. Also, she gave concerts at Columbia University, Western Michigan University, and University of Michigan. Recently she has collaborated with oboist Courtney Miller for a CD, Portuguese Perspectives. Ms. Kwon is a cofounder of Ensemble Yeon, a member of Apas Piano Duo, and currently serves as a staff pianist for the University of Iowa.

BRIANA MAXWELL (stage manager) is a proud member of the Actors' Equity Association. She is the Production Stage Manager for the Department of Dance and the Martha-Ellen Tye Opera at the University of Iowa. Her recent stage management credits include *Dance Gala In Motion*, UI Dance Company 2021, and *The Light in the Piazza* at the University of Iowa. Additional stage management credits include *Madama Butterfly* at Cedar Rapids Opera Theatre, *Ubu the King* at Williamstown Theatre Festival, and *Heartbreak House* at Montana Shakespeare in the Parks.

ANDREW RENÉ (supertitle creator and operator) is a student at the University of Iowa. Recently, he performed as a member of the Virginia Opera Herndon Foundation Emerging Artist Program, the Tulsa Opera Filene Resident Artist Program, and, most recently, the Gerdine Young Artist Program at Opera Theatre

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of Saint Louis. In September, he played the role of Andrew Young in Opera Carolina's production of I Dream, a musical drama about the life and work of Martin Luther King Jr.

ALEX ARELLANO (assistant conductor) Martín Alexander Arellano (b. 1997, California) is an active conductor and composer from the United States currently studying as a first year Masters candidate in Orchestral Conducting at the University of Iowa. Alex is the founder and current Artistic Director of the Central California Youth Wind Ensemble based in Turlock, CA that premiered its first season in 2015.

As a conductor, Alex began studying with Stuart Sims at the California State University: Stanislaus, and Robert M. Carnochan and J. Stephen Moore at the University of Miami. In 2021, Alex received a COP diploma (Cycle d'Orientation Professional) in Orchestral Direction under Miguel Etchegoncelay and Theodor Guschlbauer at the Strasbourg Conservatoire in Strasbourg, France. Alex is currently a student of Mélisse Brunet's at the University of Iowa, where he is pursuing a Master of Music in Orchestral Conducting. He has attended workshops with Neil Thomson (Philharmonic Orchestra of Goiás), David Reiland (Orchestre National de Metz), and Diane Wittry (Allentown Symphony Orchestra). Alex was also a Conducting Fellow with the Miami Symphony Orchestra with Maestro Eduardo Marturet in the 2016 - 2017 season.
