FACULTY BIOGRAPHY



Curtis Taylor is an award-winning trumpeter, performer, composer, recording artist and educator. Taylor holds a B.A. in Jazz Studies from Michigan State University and a Masters from Rutgers University.

Taylor has performed & toured internationally some of the industry's biggest names including Patrice Rushen, Charles McPherson, Billy Childs, John Clayton, Geoffrey Keezer, Terreon Gully and many more. Most notable performances and recordings include collaborations with virtuosic saxophonist James Carter, soulful Jazz pianist Cyrus Chestnut and vocal powerhouse Gregory Porter. Taylor was part of the musical team (assembled by Gregory Porter's producer Kamau Kenyatta) that won the Grammy award for Porter's *Liquid Spirit* album released on Blue Note Records in 2013. He has released two albums of his own: #Hashtagged (2017) which features produced tracks with live

instrumentation and vocals, and *Snapshot* (2019) which was recorded live with his quartet at the World Stage in Los Angeles, CA. As a performer, he has performed with his quartet across the US at many coveted venues & festivals. Recent significant performances include: Font Festival, Detroit Jazz Festival, LACMA, Bechtler Museum of Modern Art and the Blue Llama Jazz Club.

In the fall of 2021 Taylor joined the University of Iowa's Jazz department where he currently teaches Jazz history, Jazz theory and directs the Jazz Repertory Ensemble.
